

Program For Air Show To Be Dazzling

Seventy-Five Planes To Have Part in Day's Entertainment

GOEBEL WILL SPEAK

Local Stunt Men and Fliers Will Contribute Thrills May 5

With every indication pointing to the greatest gathering of airplanes and spectators ever seen in these parts, on May 5, the occasion of the formal opening of the new Iola Airport, the Iola Chapter of N.A.A., Inc., and its committee of fliers have prepared a program, which they believe will be in keeping with the magnitude of the event. Beginning at 10 o'clock in the morning and continuing until after 5:30 o'clock in the afternoon, Iola's skies will be the stage for as stupendous an aerial circus as the provinces ever have known.

Besides the thrill flying which will be presented by individual planes among the 75, which are expected if the weather is good, there will be a program of speeches by aviation's greatest figures in the Middle West.

Goebel Will Speak

Col. Arthur C. Goebel, Dole flight hero and one of the nation's most colorful aviators; and Roscoe Vaughn, national vice-president of the N.A.A., are among those who will make addresses on the day.

Iola aviators and air stunts will contribute to the saturnalia of thrills in store for the thousands of spectators expected. Archie Montgomery, tried and nervy dare devil, will jump from a plane piloted by F.W. Womack with a

parachute folded and inspected by Paul Neff. Sam Bagnall will entertain the crowds with his wing walking demonstrations from high in the air. Bagnall, too, will be piloted by F.W. Womack. "Tod" Tobey will be in the air almost continuously during the day, and will show the crowd what is meant by the term "jack rabbit hunter" which his comrades facetiously apply to his flying maneuvers. A score of skillful Iola youngsters tutored by Royal Geery, will display their wares in the airplane model contests.

Visiting pilots will display and demonstrate commercial airplanes brought here for the purpose. Army planes will fly in formation. Others will engage in stunt maneuvers high in the heavens.

Feature Planes to Come

A brand new Ford all metal monoplane: a novel, low wing mono, also all metal, and a Ryan sister ship of Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis will be among the feature planes which will be exhibited. The new "Ken-Royce," built in Salina, also will be a visitor here.

Throughout the day visiting pilots will carry passengers on tours of the skies above Iola and its territory.

One of the phases of the entertainment which is expected to add to the carnival spirit will be that everything on the program will be provided free of charge to the public except, of course, passenger rides in the airplanes coming here for that purpose.

There will be lunch and cold drink stands on the field for the convenience of those spectators who will wish to maintain their posts at the airport throughout the day.
